John started life after High School studying Law at University. He left in 1982 to pursue a career in law enforcement and was selected to join New Scotland Yard and enjoyed his life in London working in various roles and in specialist operational squads including Royalty Protection. He left London some years later to return to his beloved Scotland where he continued working in law enforcement dealing with business crime.
